Campers will be assigned to a staff counselor who they will have to sign in and out with at the beginning and end of each trip and at check in times. They will also be required to report to their assigned Staff Counselor at scheduled times throughout the trips. This is to ensure the safety of each and every one of them. - 1. NO Smoking of any kind, this includes vaping. NO alcoholic beverages, and illegal drug use is strictly prohibited.
- 2. The use of vulgar or profane language is not allowed.
- Please arrive to all trips at the scheduled times. Buses will NOT wait for those Campers who are late. Parents please pick up your Campers on time. Parents are NOT permitted to pick up or drop off children at designated field trips or meet buses on the side of the road. Please note departure and pick up times.
- 4. All Campers must wear their "Teen Travel" designated back pack at all times, unless instructed otherwise.
- 5. Fighting, stealing, abuse of equipment, grounds, facilities, etc. will not be tolerated and are subjects for dismissal from the program.
- 6. No bullying or endangering another person's well being.
- 7. Disrespect to the staff members and towards other campers will not be tolerated.
- 8. Campers **MUST** follow all the rules and regulations that pertain to the field trips, bus companies and the rules and regulations of the establishments we are visiting.
- 9. Please do not bring valuables with you on trips.
- 10. There will be no refunds for trips not attended.
- 11. Scooters, skateboards, rollerblades, etc. are NOT allowed on trips.
- 12. Campers are allowed to bring snacks with them to all trips and a lunch where indicated. Please make sure that all snacks and lunches are peanut and nut free.
- 13. All campers MUST stay with their assigned counselor. You are NOT allowed to go off on your own, unless permission is granted by the counselor. Campers MUST be with a buddy at all times.
- 14. All campers MUST have a watch with them for all trips!!!! You are NOT allowed to be late for check in times and departures.
- 15. Campers are encouraged to bring cell phones with them if they have them. (You **MUST** follow all rules pertaining to cell phones at all locations. i.e. theatres)
- 16. Any Camper that cannot abide by these rules will be dismissed immediately from the Teen Adventure Program. No refunds will be granted. NO EXCEPTIONS! Remember, you are responsible for your actions.
- 17. Please notify our department of any restrictions or limitations that we should be aware of prior to traveling.
- 18. Have a safe and fun summer!!!!!

NOTE: The Parks and Recreation Department and the Teen Adventure staff are not responsible for lost electronic items. Participants who bring them are doing so at their own risk. be careful when walking through the parking lot.



Sign In and Sign Out Procedures:

All Campers are required to sign in each morning with their assigned counselor prior to the beginning of each trip. Campers must sign in at all check points and **MUST** be on time. At the end of each trip Campers **MUST** sign out with their counselor.

Parents and Travelers: Please **NOTE** that at the beginning and end of each trip announcements, reminders, changes, etc. are made to let Campers know about the next trip, ie. departure times, what to bring, special requirements, etc. If your child has missed a trip, please call the **OFFICE** for updates. **DO NOT** call the counselors. Thank you, and remember you can always call the office anytime with questions, 203-488-8304. We ask that you be prompt for all pick up and drop off times. Parents who are picking up at end of the day are asked to <u>please</u> <u>be on time</u>. Our staff will stay to make sure that all Campers are picked up, but if you are excessively late you will be charged a late fee, \$10.00 for every 15 minutes or part of 15 minutes that you are late.

We have again partnered with the Board of Education to provide Free Meals for the Summer. Campers will be able to have a healthy breakfast and lunch for all trips.



Participant Code of Conduct

During the camp we have developed a code of conduct to make sure that everyone has a positive camp experience. This means that all participants: campers, parents/ guardians, and staff shall respect the individual rights, safety and property of others.

Parents: Please review these rules with your child **I will:**

- Respect the differences in other people, and make an effort to include everyone, and refrain from behaviors that may hurt another camper or staff member's feelings.
- Be mindful of my counselors and respect their request and follow their directions.
- Pick up after myself and throw away all trash.
- Respect other people's property.
- Let my counselor know if I am or I am not having a good time at camp.
- Respect the staff, animals and places that we visit.
- Have fun at camp in ways that are safe to others and myself.
- Have a positive attitude.

I will Not:

- Fight with other campers with my hands or my words.
- Bring candy or soda to camp.
- Share food with another camper.
- Go anywhere without permission and accompaniment of my counselor.
- Use derogatory terms or offensive language when talking to or about other campers.
- Tease or bully other campers.
- Bring inappropriate items (includes electronics, weapons, drugs, etc) to camp.

If I choose not to follow the code of conduct:

First Time: I will be given a verbal warning explaining the problem and the expected behavior.

- **Second Time:** I will be removed from the activity and my parent will be called; The Camp Director or their designee may call home to discuss the behavior plan.
- Third Time: The Camp Director will be notified and my parents will be called to pick me up.

Dismissal of a Camper: Summer 2024

There will be the occasional camper who will not follow the rules or their behavior or actions may be disruptive to other Travelers, staff members, or establishments that we visit. We have high expectations of behavior and expect that you will obey the rules set forth by the Branford Parks & Recreation Teen Travel Adventure Program, the transportation service companies that we use, and the establishments that we visit. The following process will be followed in situations that are not grounds for immediate dismissal.

Step 1: A Camper will be given a verbal warning from the counselor or another staff member present. A course of action for changing the behavior should be discussed at this time. The Camper will be warned that similar behavior/ actions will result in contact with parents. The incident should be reported to the supervisor of the Program or their designee immediately.

Step 2: If similar behavior / actions occurs again, the counselor or the staff member present will give a verbal reprimand. The incident will be reported to the supervisor of the Program or their designee who will contact the parents to discuss the issue.

Step 3: If similar behaviors occurs again, the Supervisor of the Teen Adventure Program or the Assistant Director will notify the parents that the Camper has been removed from an activity, a trip(s) or from the program and they may not return to the program for the rest of the summer.

The Teen Travel Adventure Supervisor, The Program Supervisor, The Program Coordinator, the Assistant Director and the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department always reserve the right, when the behavior or actions are particularly flagrant or disruptive or against the law, to dismiss the Camper from the program immediately.

I have read the above policy set forth by the Branford Parks and Recreation Department Staff and agree that I will abide by all the rules and regulations set forth. I will conduct myself in an appropriate manner and know that I am responsible for my behavior and actions. I also agree to abide by all rules and regulations set forth by the establishments that we visit and the transportation companies used.

Sunscreen Permission:



Appropriate sunscreen use is important to prevent skin damage and sunburn. If you child is able to apply his or her own sunscreen, we strongly suggest that they do so prior to coming to camp. We will remind them to re-apply their sunscreen throughout the day. Parents are strongly encouraged to apply sunscreen to their child(ren) each day prior to arrival at camp. In addition, parents are asked to provide sunscreen clearly labeled camper name. The Branford Parks and Recreation Department does not provide sunscreen. If requested and authorized, staff will assist in applying parent/guardian provided sunscreen as a courtesy and in the best interest of your child.

The Branford Parks and Recreation Department's policy on applying sunscreen is as follows: Each child will apply parent-provided sunscreen to his/her skin personally. When necessary and as requested by a parent/guardian, a Branford Parks and Recreation Staff member will assist a child that may be unable to personally apply his/her own sunscreen on only the exposed parts of the child's skin and, when possible, while another staff member.
